**Policy Statement:**

Transwaste have established an ISO 14001:2015 Environmental management system which provides a framework for measuring and improvement of our performance.

Top management have established, implemented, and will continue to maintain an environmental policy that, within the defined scope of our management system:

a) is appropriate to the purpose and context of the Transwaste, including the nature, scale and environmental impacts of its activities, products for setting environmental objectives;

b) provide a framework for setting environmental objectives;

- 1) ensure that the EA compliance rating does not increase above band C
- 2) replace carcinogenic chemicals with environmentally friendlier options where applicable
- 3) ensure that 80% of our fleet is Euro 6 compliant
- 4) complete 1 x external duty of care audit per month
- 5) become an electric charging station by 2023
- 6) reduce the amount of diesel used on site
- 7) reduce paper usage by implementing electronic systems for permit, site inspections and defects
- 8) upgrade wind turbines to more efficient models increasing from 2.3mw to 4.2mw by 2023
- 9) ensure 90% compliance of internal audits

c) we are committed to the protection of the environmental, including prevention of pollution, sustainable resource use and climate change;

d) we are committed to fulfil our compliance obligations;


e) we are committed to continual improvement of the environmental management system to enhance environmental performance.
